This is despite such intervention being identified as vital to promote emotional wellbeing among children and young people and to prevent them from escalating into more serious mental health conditions later in life. 3 The main recommendations and conclusions of the APMG Innovation Report into the mental health and wellbeing of young people have been disregarded. "
