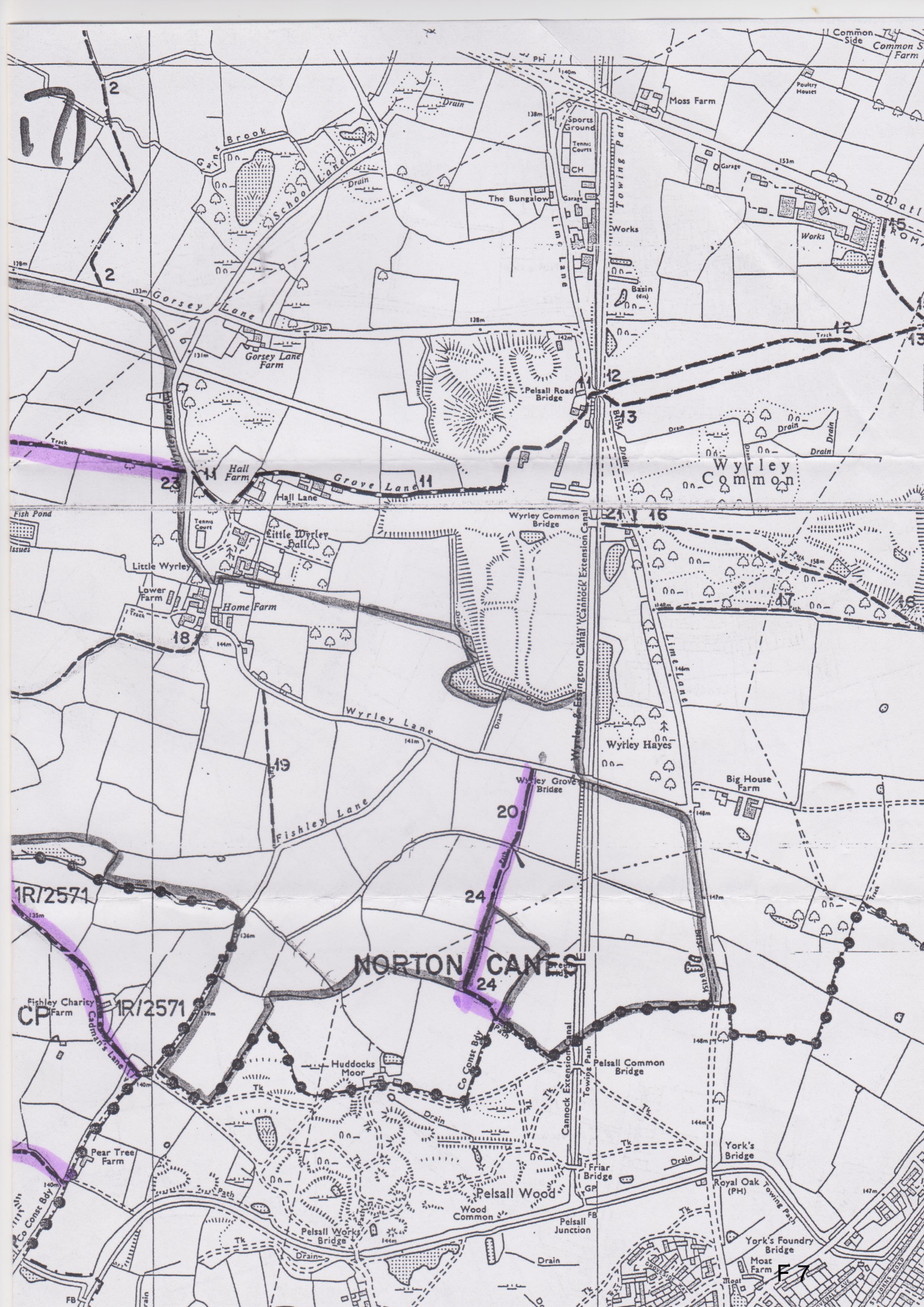

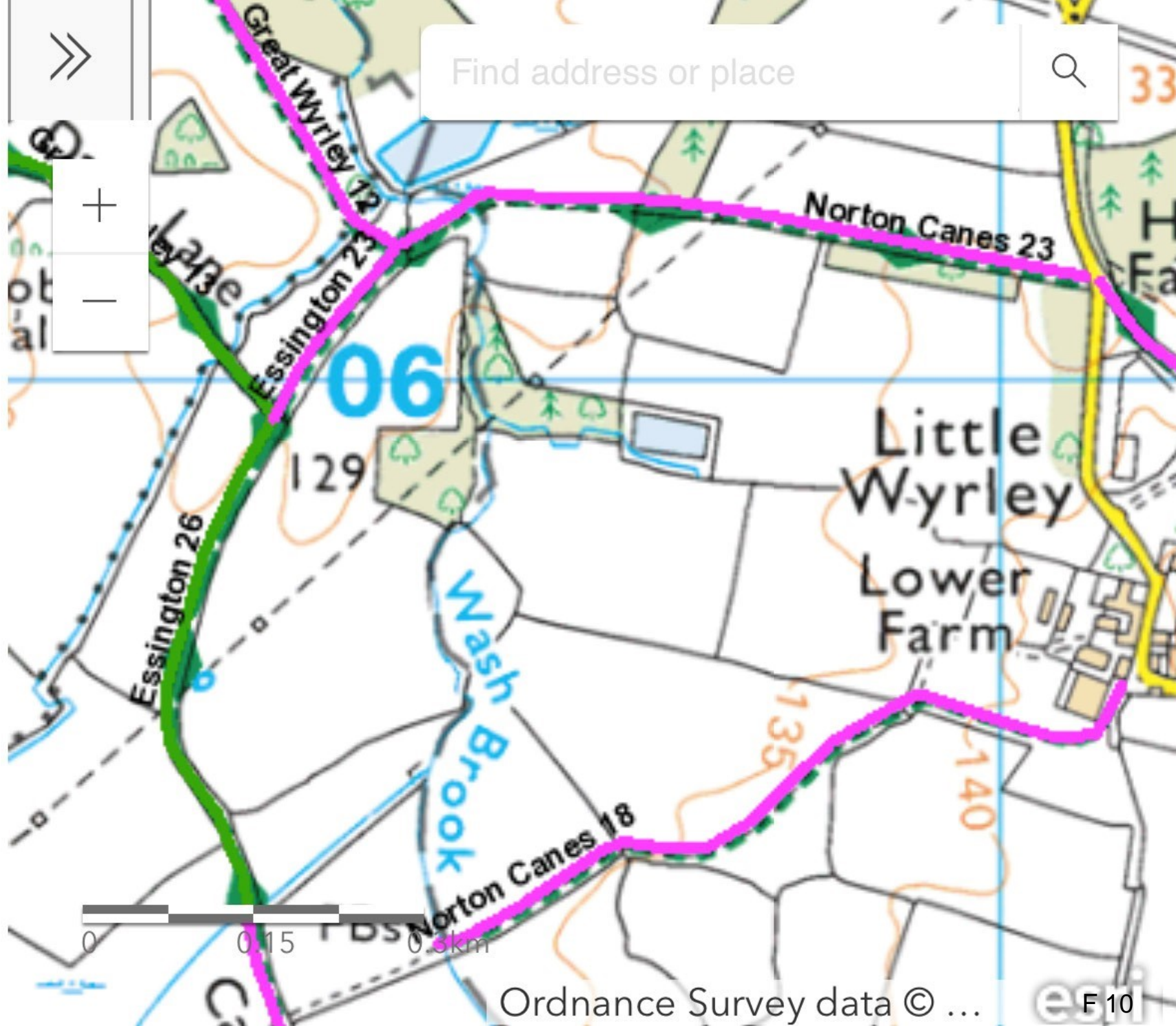

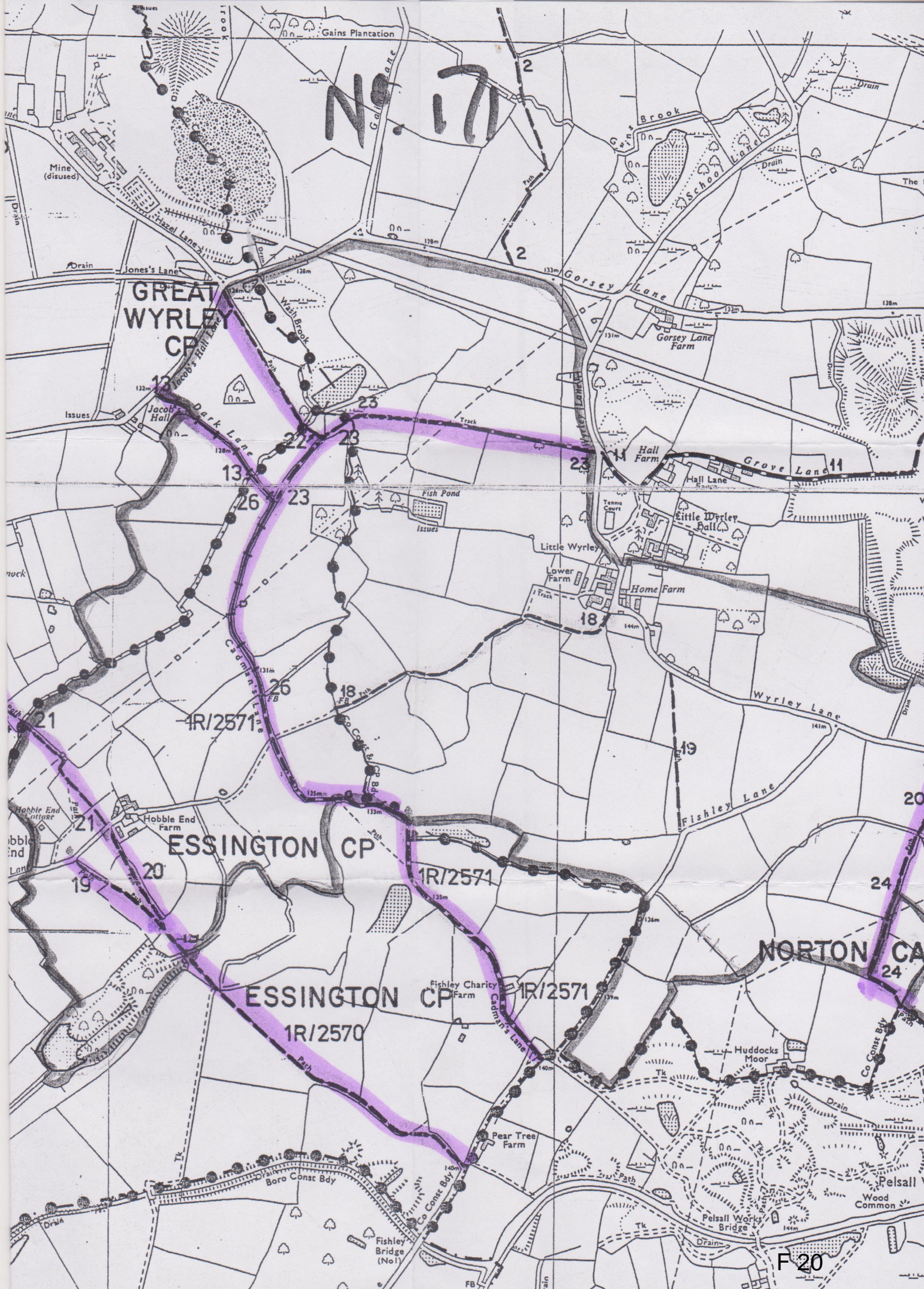

BUT ARE IN MY EXPERIENCE VERY ABIDING.

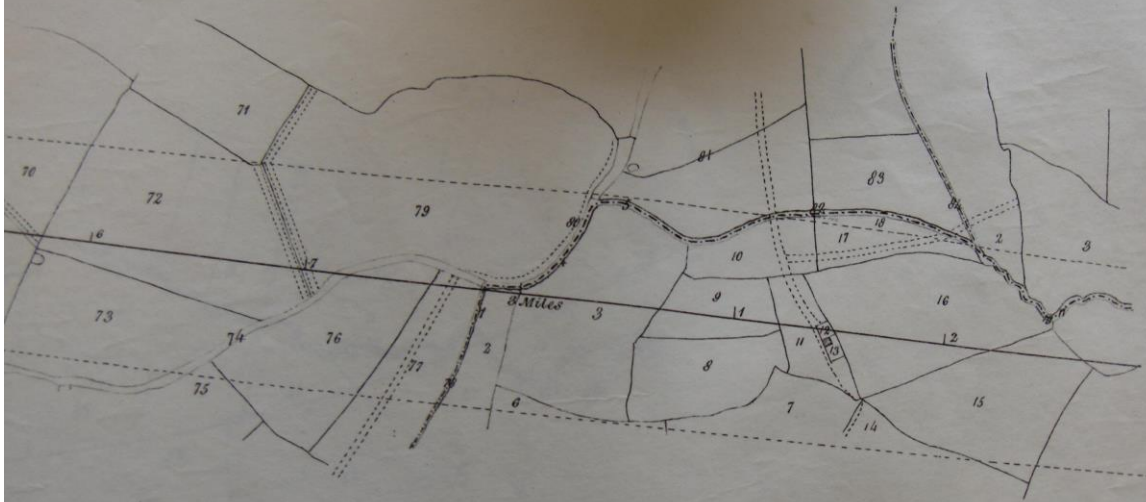

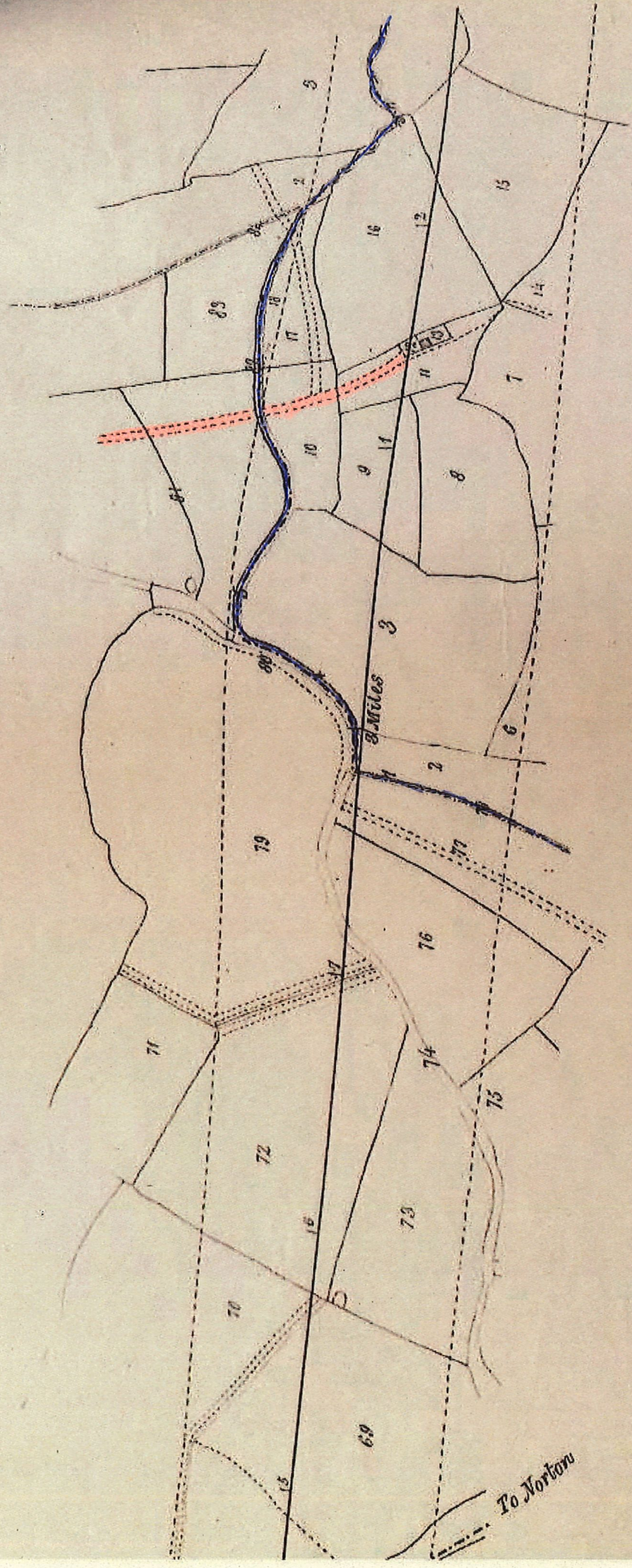

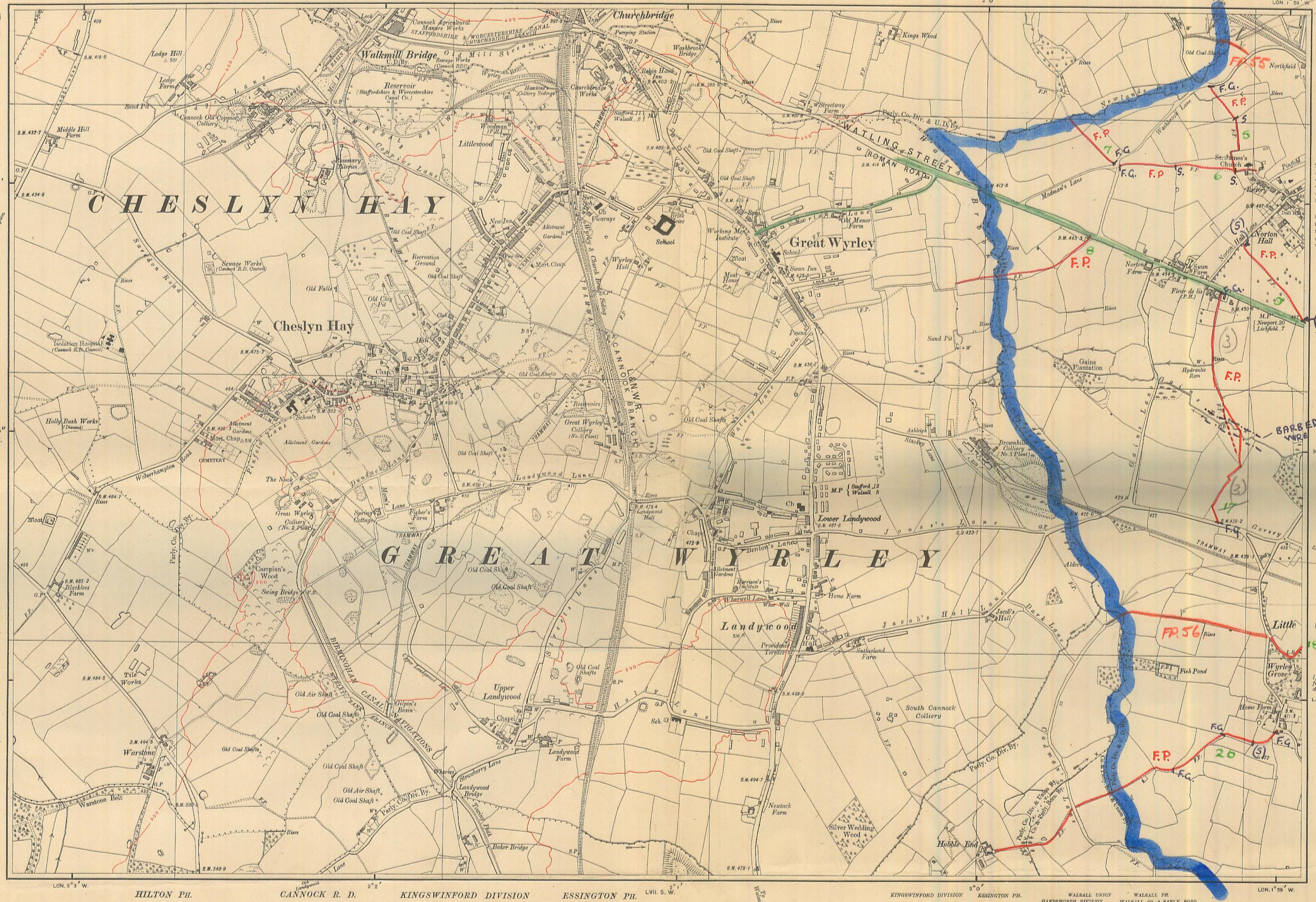

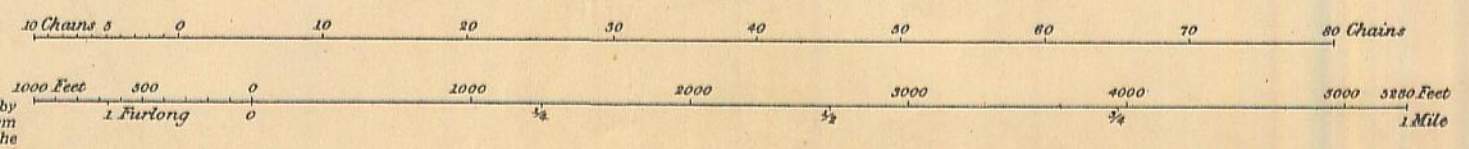
