"Shirleywich Road" – One other public horse carriage and Drift Road from Hixton aforesaid to the Turnpike Road near Shirleywich called the Shirleywich road ancient cottages and gardens of the said Robert Earl Ferrers the ninth allotment to the said Robert Earl Ferrers in Hixton in the parish of Stow the second allotment to Thomas Anson Esquire Son and Heir of the said George Anson deceased and the fourth allotment to the said Robert Earl Ferrers in Hixton in the parish of Colwich on the northwardly side thereof Ancient enclosures of the said Robert Earl Ferrers called the Long Croft the paddock the Cross Hays Meadow the seventh allotment to the said Robert Earl Ferrers in Hixton in the parish of Colwich the fourth allotment to the said Thomas Clifford in Hixton in the Parish of Colwich the seventh allotment to the said Robert Earl Ferrers in Hixton in the Parish of Stow the allotment to Stephen Gilbert in Hixton in the Parish of Colwich and the eighth allotment to the said Robert Earl Ferrers in Hixton in the Parish of Stow on the southwardly side thereof ..."

**"Stafford Public Bridle Road"** – One public bridle road leading from the westwardly end of the said public carriage road herein before set out called Shirleywich Road across the said Turnpike Road into and over in a westwardly direction the sixth allotment to the said Robert Earl Ferrers in Hixton in the Parish of Stow to a bridge over the canal and across the said Bridge into and over (in the same direction) the fifth allotment to the said Robert Earl Ferrers in Hixton in the Parish of Stow to and from an ancient ford in the River Trent called Ingestre-Ford"

"... and we do hereby order and direct that all the said private carriage roads and also the aforesaid public bridle roads shall from time to time by supported and kept in repair in the same manner and by the same means as other public roads within the said Hamlet of Hixton are by law to be amended and kept in repair"

"Stafford foot road" – One other public footway leading along a public bridle road herein before set out and called the Stafford Bridle Road and we do hereby order and direct that







all and every the footbridges gates and stile and other conveniences necessary for the passage and accommodation of persons travelling on foot in over and along the several footways herein before set out shall be made erected and set up and at all times hereafter repaired supported maintained and kept in repair by the persons in whose fence or upon whose land such footbridges gates or stiles and other conveniences are necessary".
