Whereas by an act of

parliament made and passed in the fifty fourth year of the reign of his present

majesty King George third intituled "An Act for enclosing Lands in the parish

of Sandon in the County of Stafford After reciting therein amongst other things

That an act was passed in the forty first year of the reign of his said Majesty intituled

"An Act for consolidating in one act certain provisions usually inserted in acts of

parliament and for facilitating the mode of passing the several acts usually required

in the passing of such acts" I the said Robert Harvey am appointed the Commissioner

for dividing setting out and allotting the commons and waste grounds within the

parish of Sandon aforesaid in manner therein directed and for carrying the same

acts into execution under and subject to such of the rules orders directions provisions

and restrictions contained in the said therein recited acts as were not repugnant to

the powers in the said first mentioned Act **Now know** that I the said

Robert Harvey having taken and subscribed the Oath hereunto annexed as

directed by the said Act of the forty first year of the reign of his said Majesty

to administer to Charles Heaton of Sandon in the parish of Lick in the said County of

Stafford Land Surveyor the person appointed by me to make all surveys delineations

and plans requisite and necessary to be made and taken for the purpose of carrying

the said acts into execution in Oath to verify such surveys and having completed

the division and allotments of the said commons and waste grounds and executed

the several matters and things required and authorized to be done and performed

by me by the said acts and I the said Robert Harvey in pursuance of the directions

contained in the said acts have caused to be drawn up this my Award and do hereby

make publish and declare the same as follows **First** I find from the Survey and

admeasurement which has been made by the said Charles Heaton and verified by him

in Oath as aforesaid that the lands and grounds by the said recited act of the fifty

fourth year of the reign of his said Majesty directed to be inclosed contain in statute

measure three hundred and thirty seven acres and seventeen perches including

public and private carriage roads and foot paths and ways and I have annexed

to a map or plan of the said Lands and grounds so surveyed and admeasured as

said and which plan I declare to be taken as part of this my award on which are

repeated the situation of the several allotments with their respective Boundaries

with other particulars as I think necessary and on which are also delineated

sections of the public and private roads and ways and foot paths which I

set out and adjudged necessary over the said Lands and grounds

I have inserted in the margin of this my award opposite to the

situation of each road the name by which I have called the same respectively

are as follows (that is to say) -
