2 FTE posts (3 members of staff) are employed in the Coroners service and 2 Casual staff	Co-location of staff and integration of the two teams will allow them to provide a more robust and consistent service to relatives of the bereaved.		Current staff will not be asked to move to a new office base outside of Staffordshire on a fulltime basis and will be able to work flexibly including working from home on occasions. A Coronial presence is being maintained in Stafford. Staff will transfer to Stoke local authority via TUPE arrangements. All staff currently employed were aware at the time of their appointment that the centralised office base would be Stoke and a change of base would occur
