This website is used by Staffordshire County Council to keep an up to date list of streets that are maintainable at public expense under s.36 of the Highways Act 1980. This website replaces the List of Streets previously held by the County Council. It provides evidence of the street name and whether it is maintained by the County Council.

Conclusions from information:

- 1. All routes shown on the 1929 Handover map for routes in the area of Waterhouses FP 60 are still Highways Maintained at Public Expense, and are C and D class public vehicular highways.
- 2. Waterhouses FP 60 is the only route marked on the Handover Map that is not a Highway Maintained at Public Expense.

3. Dukes Lane at the southern end of the claimed route and Tatlers Lane at the northern end are both numbered as the D1127 road.

4. Dukes Lane, Waterhouses FP 60 and Tatlers Lane all comprise the same route marked by a black line on the Handover Map. No distinction is made between the two HMPE's and Waterhouses FP 60.

5. No footpaths or bridleways in the area (apart from the application route) are shown on the Handover map.

6. This is evidence that all the routes shown on the 1929 Handover map were considered by the County Surveyor to be public vehicular highways at that time.
