Alleged Public Footpath between
Deep Hays and Crownpoint, Cheddleton



With reference to your letter dated the 4th July, 1990 with enclosure, there is lack of clear evidence of this path on the ground. However, the tracks marked are clear to follow between WX and YZ as shown on the attached plan. The path is not obvious where it leaves the track at A. At B and C, there are no stiles but low field walls. There is some evidence of recent re-building at point B on the attached plan.

In our view a path on this line would fulfill a valuable amenity function in linking the Deep Hayes Country Park with nearby attractive countryside and also with the expanding residential area at Cheddleton.

The ground conditions being for the most part of solid tracks would need little (if any) attention. Costs might, therefore, be minor ones comprising mainly of signposting and the creation or replacement of stiles at points A, B and C on the attached plan.

To sum up, therefore, we suggest that the path proposed would be welcomed by the Staffordshire Moorlands District Council because of its beneficial contribution to local amenity and the relatively low costs of maintenance providing there is sufficient documentary evidence of its existence.

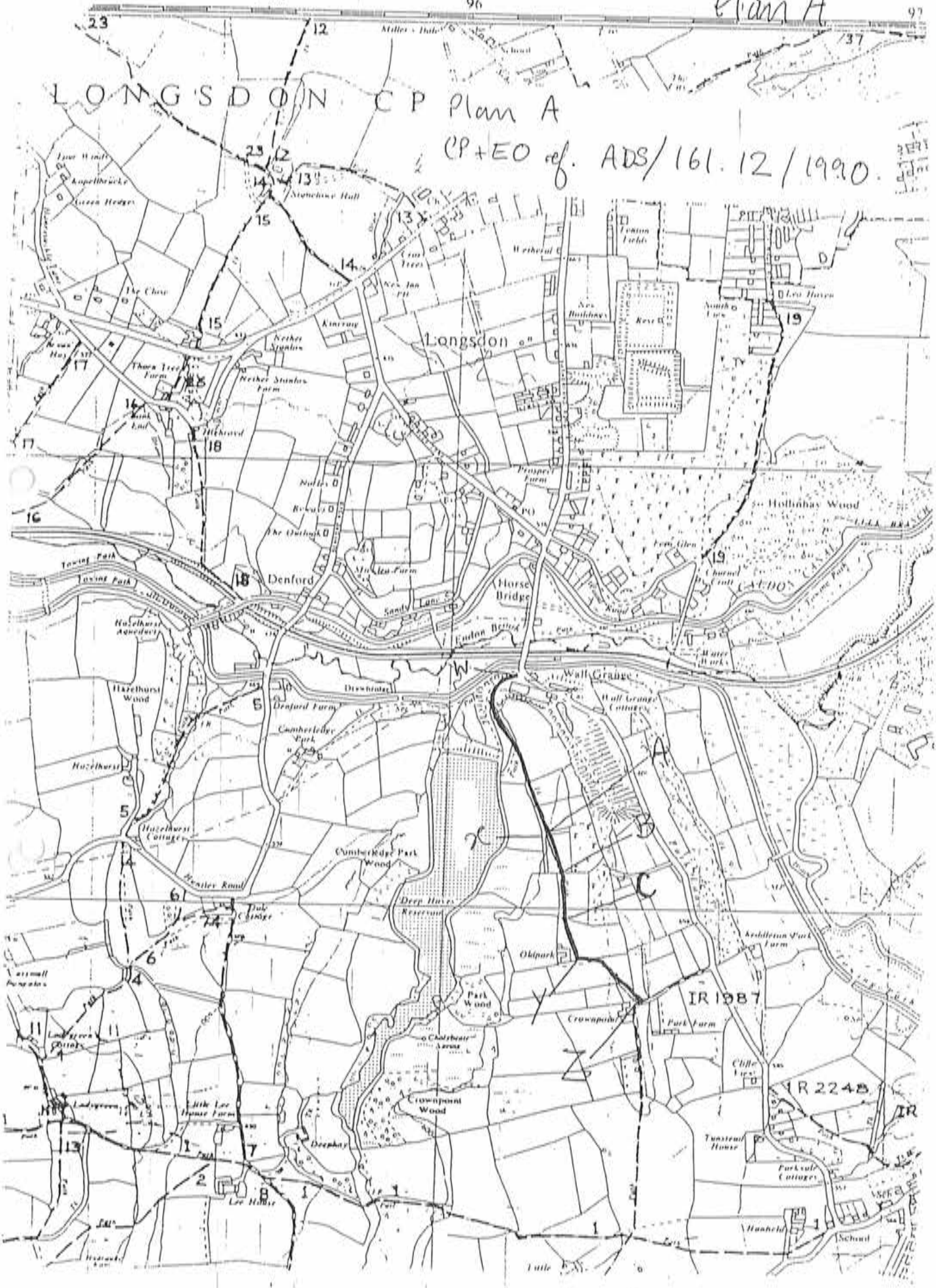
