



Extract of Waterfall Tithe Map dated 1844 Source: Staffordshire Record Office, Reference B-A-15-326



This Tithe Map shows the route to the south of Grindon FP 12 (part) where it crosses the Parish Boundary between Waterfall and Grindon as going "To Grindon". This is evidence that the application route is a road between villages in 1844. This is the most direct route to Grindon village for the residents of the north eastern portion of Waterfall.


