3.1 That members of SACRE reflect on the report as it could have implications for the RE rationale within the Agreed Syllabus. The conclusion is that RE contributes to greatly to pupils' character development and that RE teachers should model good character for their pupils.

4.1 The recent inclusion of character development in the latest Ofsted handbook demonstrates that ideas of character are receiving renewed attention. This brings into focus that teachers of RE should have more opportunities to reflect on their own worldviews and consider the effect on their world views on their teaching practice.
