

Staffordshire We George Jolley and Francis Inverline Esquires two of His Majesty's  
to wit Justices of the peace for the said County acting within the Northern Division of the Hundred of  
Prestole within the said County at a special Sessions held at The Sutherland Arms Inn in  
the parish of Trentham within the said Division in the said County on the ninth Day of September  
one thousand eight hundred and thirty four having upon view found That certain part of a  
public Bridleway within the several Parishes of Keele Whitmore and Swinerton in the said Division in  
the said County lying between a certain Lane called Ram Lane in the Parish of Keele aforesaid  
and a certain Woods called Oxhay Wood in the said Parish of Swinerton for the length  
of Two thousand five hundred and ten yards or thereabouts and particularly described in the  
plan hereto annexed may be diverted and turned so as to make the same nearer and more  
convenient to the public and having viewed a course proposed for the new public  
Bridleway in lieu thereof through the Lands and Grounds of Ralph Sneyd of Keele Hall in the  
said County Esquire and Sarah Mainwaring of Whitmore Hall in the same County Spinster  
of the length of Two thousand three hundred and ninety three furlongs or thereabouts and of the  
breadth of six feet or thereabouts particularly described in the plan hereto annexed And further  
received testimony of the consent of the said Ralph Sneyd and Sarah Mainwaring respectively to the  
said new bridle way being made through their lands herein before described by writing under their  
respective hands and seals We do hereby order that the said new public bridle way be  
diverted and turned through the lands aforesaid And we do order an equal assessment  
not exceeding the rate of six pence in the pound to be made levied and collected upon all and  
every the Occupiers of Lands Tenements Woods Tythes and Hereditaments in the said  
Parishes of Keele Whitmore and Swinerton And that the money arising thereupon be paid over  
applied in making recompence and satisfaction to the said Ralph Sneyd and Sarah  
Mainwaring for the lands and grounds and for the making such Ditches and Fences as  
shall be necessary in such manner and by pursuing such measures and directions in all  
respect as are warranted and prescribed by the Statute made in the Thirteenth Year of the  
Reign of his late Majesty King George the Third for the amendment and preservation of  
the Highways
