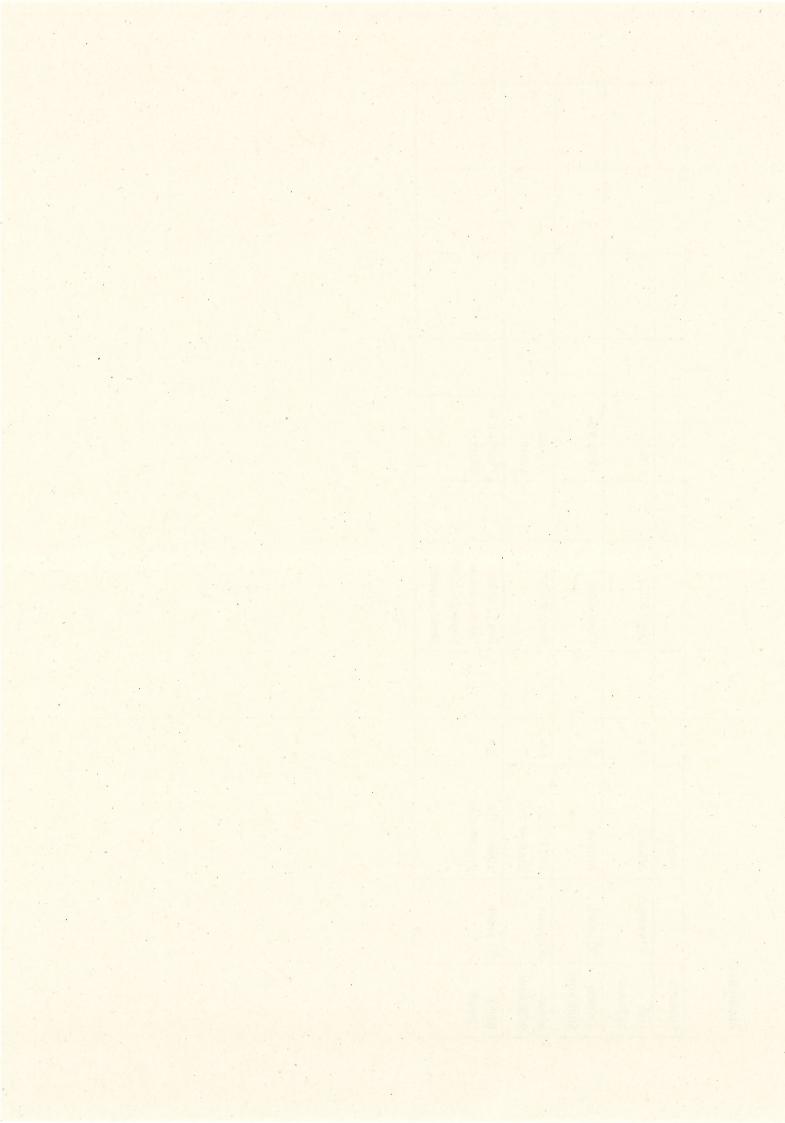

Alleged Public Footpath at the rear of Ox Pasture, Cheddleton.

We thank you for your letter of the 2nd of November, 1995 which crossed with and answered ours of the 3rd of November, 1995.

The land in question is a private footpath and was described as such in a Conveyance of the 23rd of July, 1931 between the late Solomon Bowcock and the late George Arthur Lymer whose descendant owns the triangular pasture field immediately to the north. The private footpath land is vested in the Executors of the late Philip Thornley Bowcock.

We are instructed by the Executors to act in the matter and to object to this proposal. One has to ask why, if this has been a footpath for 60 years, there only now comes forward a proposal to designate it as a public footpath? It is significant that no action was taken so to designate it following the enactment of the 1959 legislation.

There is no legitimate purpose in the proposal since running parallel to it and only 50 metres away is an excellent wide pavement along Ox Pasture. This adequately serves all possible needs for traffic on foot.

You should be aware that there has been some controversy over an application by Messrs. Alcock and Bailey to develop Mr. Lymer's field. It seems likely that this application, made at this stage, is a ploy and a misuse of the footpaths legislation with a view to obtaining some possible debating advantage in the planning dispute. The proposal amounts to an attempt at expropriation, taking advantage of the tolerance of the owners.

No, as it was not necessary.

- No, as until recently there was no evidence of use. When previously inspected it was overgrown. It has recently been cleared and investigations are being undertaken as to who authorised this intrusion on private land.
- 11. Have you taken any other steps to prevent the presumed dedication of the path as a public right of way? No, since any use by the public could give rise to the presumption. The land runs parallel to Ox Pasture with an NOTE Section 31(1) of the Highways Act 1980 states that:- excellent pavement only 50 yards away.

"Where a way over any land, other than a way of such a character that use of it by the public could not give rise at common law to any presumption of dedication, has been actually enjoyed by the public as of right and without interruption for a full period of 20 years, the way is to be deemed to have been dedicated as a highway unless there is sufficient evidence that there was no intention during that period to dedicate it."
